

TEMPLATE MARGINS



You have the option of leaving an outer margin between the edge of the page and your photos or having the photos go to the edge of the page. This is known as a “bleed”.

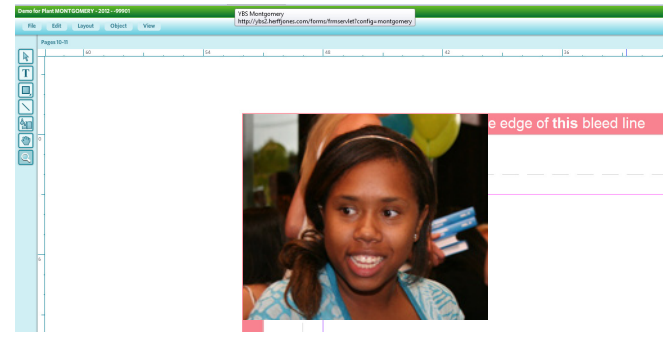
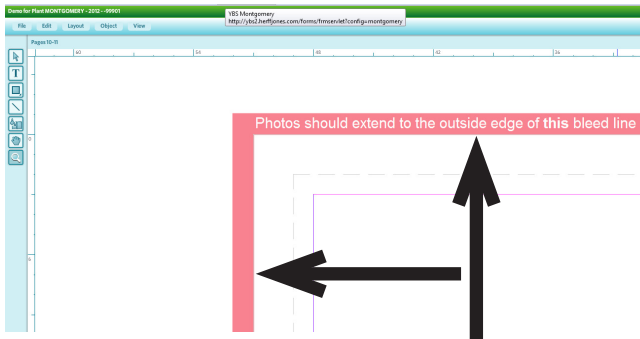

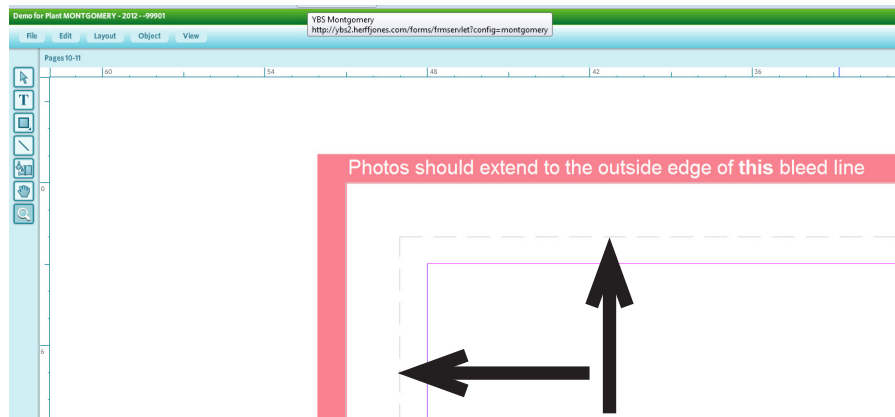

Photos and art that you want to “bleed” should extend to the outside edge of the salmon colored line on the template. The inside edge of the salmon line is where the book will be trimmed.



The grey, dashed line is to indicate the area within you should keep all type and/or graphics that you do not wish to bleed or get cut off when the book is trimmed. Trimming of yearbooks is a mechanical process and there can be slight variations in the trimming of each batch when they go through the cutting machine. Keeping type and photos within this line keeps these items from being trimmed off.



The magenta and purple lines indicate a margin area that is useful for design continuity. Keeping all text, photos and graphics within this area will give you a larger outside margin. If you prefer, you can extend to the gray dashed line.
