 "It's not about us, it's because of us."







How to Take a Picture

1. First, take a picture of your press pass.
2. Transition yourself in a unique angle.
3. Make sure you have the camera on the correct setting depending on what type of picture you are taking.
4. Focus on your target and keep in mind what kind of picture you want to take.
5. Include variety in your pictures and try to get a lot of people in your pictures (avoid backs of heads).
6. Finally, turn off the camera and follow this structure for turning in your camera

Celebrating yearbook BUYERS is a great way to increase awareness of book sales and to reward people for buying their books early. This year we borrowed a prize wheel from SMUD (through Katelyn's mom), gave out free photos (we used our new Selphy printers we got from Donors Choose) and we made homemade scratchers with a variety of prizes... just use soap and paint 1:1!





My Videos




