


Using the Index to IMPROVE



Running across the top of spreads, the ACD in Chaparral HS in Parker, CO includes eight student quotes. Their theme was "It Doesn't Have to Make Sense to be Perfect" and organization was chronological by week. Each spread asks a different question that relates to both the theme and the spread contents. For example, this is a summer spread and the question asks, "What's the perfect thing to do during summer?" Other questions took the opposite approach such as, "What doesn't make sense about the new bell schedule?" on a spread about the beginning of the year.
