INCLUDE DETAILS IN WRITING

- 1. Partner students up for the interview. It is best that the teacher do this, rather than allowing students to choose partners because the goal is to listen and observe.
- 2. Distribute a One Word Activity packet to each student. (page 2)
- 3. Students will interview each other using the provided questions. The person being interviewed may only use one word to answer.
- 4. Students should switch places. The interviewer now becomes the interviewee and vice versa.

If you want to extend the activity, have students use the answers they received from their interviews to write a Person Poem about their interview subject.
